Earlywood


Special education is a Federal entitlement for students and their parents. The decisions you make could have significant positive impacts for your students or could lead you to a courtroom. Come learn strategies to make appropriate and legally sound decisions which will help prevent special education litigation. Topics to be covered will include (1) ensuring an appropriate IEP; (2) what it means to teach students in the LRE; (3) how students with disabilities are disciplined differently; (4) why we must plan for students' lives beyond high school; and (5) why fostering positive family-school relationships is important.

- Review and expand upon the CPI training concepts per Earlywood practice it is required that all participants review course content to refresh their skills once each school year.

CPI Response Team Training Full 2-Day Initial Training

Initial training is for school personnel who have not been CPI certified, or those who have a CPI certification that has expired. Learn reinforcing preventive techniques and practice a progression of non-harmful physical intervention. **This training is appropriate for site crisis response teams** who will be responsible for implementing non-harmful physical intervention techniques when necessary. Training will also review documentation and opportunities for more situational roll-play. It is recommended that site teams participate in the same training for extended team building and collaboration.




