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The Visual Impairment Licensure Program is designed to prepare Indiana teachers to work with students who are blind or have low vision. The project is made possible through the PASS grant which is funded by the Indiana Department of Education through the Blumberg Center at Indiana State University.

This graduate level program consists of 16 credit hours of course work, each offered primarily through distance education. Cohorts begin each fall and students enroll in one course per semester.

Students accepted into the program are responsible for all tuition costs. The PASS grant provides all textbooks and materials at no cost to students.
