# Procedural Changes- Why?

- Doors to office areas locked – procedural change
- Potential threats- heightened awareness
- First Aid kit locations- more staff trained
- New emergency signs in areas- improved safety
- Fire Marshall suggestions- it's the law!

# Sudden Death- Page 6

- Alert Now System- make sure all your contact numbers are up-to-date
- Different groups will be established by Pam and Beth ahead of time in case of an emergency situation
- You will be called using the Alert Now System- ignore the call if you choose

# Personnel Illness/Injury- Page 6

- CPR list- if certified, give name to Bill
- First Aid kits- Rooms 150,300 and 450
- Phone labeling- reminder to call 9-911

# Intruders/Threats- Page 7-8

- Lockdown Procedures have changed!!
- We will be using ALICE (handout)- **significant changes made here**
- What is ALICE? (step by step)- refer to pg. 8
- Threat Procedures- **significant changes**

# Code Blue- Page 9

- Let's review the procedure- Sandy Finney

# Bomb Threats- Page 10

- Small changes
- Big change- DO NOT LEAVE THE BUILDING- await law enforcement or administrator directives



# Earthquake/Tornado- Page 11

- Earthquake- New procedure- read this on your own
- Tornado- Some changes- new directions in rooms-  
KNOW YOUR AREA
- Explanation between a “watch” and “warning”

# Fire- Page 12

- No significant changes- KNOW YOUR AREA and where to go
- If you see a fire, DO NOT WAIT TO REPORT IT, react by pulling the alarm- *Bill- fire station alarm locations @ EEC*

# ANY Evacuation of EEC

- **IMPORTANT:** If you are unable to get to Fire Station 23 during the actual emergency, you **MUST** report to Fire Station 23 in order for accounting for all staff and students.
- **REMEMBER:** Cell phones may not be able to be used so do not count on them as your main communication source

# What Else Do I Need to Know

- Be proactive- if you see a fire, an intruder, etc., act, don't wait on someone else. The life you save may be your own.
- Table Top conversations- periodically there will be situations to plan and discuss.
- Ask EVERYONE to identify self **and** who they are to see before opening the door.
- Be aware of your surroundings and learn the building.
- Safe Place- Station #23- path
- Police Liaison- will be visiting the building- Officer Brian
